This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, ipads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 11<sup>th</sup> September and 26<sup>th</sup> October. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

Spring is here! It's the wonderful season of warm mornings, blossoming trees and flourishing gardens! I can't wait until temperatures start going up and we see our areas come back to life once more. Of course, in the past, it seemed as though summer came too early and the climate was so hot that we needed to cover the garden



with shade cloth. I'm really hoping to enjoy the beauty of the garden a little more this year. Right now, the garden is full of a variety of flowers for the bees and butterflies to enjoy. There are some birds too (some of them unwanted) that sing lovely melodies in the morning. In Week 7, the students were busy helping me mulch, pull weeds and sow seeds ready for harvesting in summer. The students have also been busy getting the new garden ready for Term 4. We are very excited to plant some Australian native plants into our new bush garden. Right now we have so much work to do, but the willing and hardworking students really make a huge difference.
