Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden News.....

It is the last term of the year... Welcome to term 4! Coming back from the two week break, we took advantage of the cool weather getting ready for the hot summer that's just around the corner. Stage 3 enjoyed spreading the mulch around the garden and pulled out most of the weeds. We also enjoyed harvesting the last of our winter vegetables. We harvested 12 broccoli heads, 9 cauliflowers, a few fennel bulbs, peas, beans, leeks, beetroot, some cabbages and kale. Our cabbages are still growing and slowly maturing, and no doubt they will be eaten soon. We have plenty of potatoes, carrots and garlic, too. Last week, we started to plant some of our summer fruit and vegetable seedlings. Our shade cloth is doing its job protecting the plants from the heat. Last week the heat was quite intense in the garden. It only took two weeks for the summer heat to suddenly arrive!

Our garden is looking good and the soil is finally healthy. There are plenty of worms (which is a good sign of healthy soil) and it's definitely the reason for the abundance of crops. The smell of the citrus flowers are amazing. Busy bees are buzzing about everywhere and just loving what's around them. Our native garden is also doing well. Plants have started to flower and our kangaroo paw plants are looking amazing! If time permits, we are going start working on some more art around the school garden. As for our 'ladies', they seem very happy and healthy. They're laying good, healthy eggs and are, of course, loving their home.

We have had such an amazing time in the kitchen. The students have worked so hard preparing and cooking some delicious meals. We cooked *Vegetable stir-fry with freshly made egg noodles, Savoury pastry with silverbeet and leek, Apple and fennel salad*, our famous *Gözleme, Cauliflower fritters, Coleslaw salad, Lemon cake, sponge cake* and *Pasta with cabbage and potato*. Our favourite dish was our lemon cake. Our cauliflower fritters were a hit too! Students were very proud of what they achieved in the kitchen. They take so much pride in what they do, either preparing the vegetables, cooking or simply setting up the tables. Week 3 is going to be kitchen week. Our last term will mainly focus on international food. We have an exciting time ahead of us as we are going to use most of our cabbages, potatoes and grape leaves. I guess Chinese dumpling, Filipino spring rolls, Greek dolmades and Indian curries are going to be on the menu this week.

Thank you to all the families who have donated sprouting potatoes, olive oil, seeds from Woolworths and donating their \$5 per term. Your donations help this amazing program so much. Until next time, Cazendra.


