Staffing News

We also welcome to the school Miss Brittany Murphy who will be the teacher of Class 6. We are excited to have her on board and know she will enjoy being a part of the St Clair community. Originally Ms Young was going to teach Class 6, however, she was fortunate to be offered a role in another school for 2020 and we wish her all the best with this move.

2020 Student Leadership

On Monday 17th February, at assembly, our 2020 student leaders will be inducted into their leadership positions and receive their badges. This includes our captains and prefects, class SRC members, library monitors and sport house leaders. It has been lovely to see the way our captains and prefects have already undertaken their leadership roles. Well done!

Maintenance

Over the school break significant major works were completed (with some still ongoing) across the school. The whole school was re-roofed which included new guttering, fascia and downpipes. All air-conditioning units were removed and placed at ground level. Eight brand new air-conditioning units were installed, along with new solar panels. The artificial grass area was repaired. Four classrooms have new Interactive Whiteboards. Some of the classrooms are about to be installed with new concertina doors.

Parking

Thank you to our parents and carers for adhering to my request not to access the school carpark. As per my letter sent home at the end of last year, we are no longer issuing parking permits. I am sure you can appreciate and understand that with a staff of 45 and only 22 parking splaces, it was necessary to no longer continue this practice. The car park is a staff only and deliveries only car park and not open for public parking. Thank you again for supporting this request.

Attendance

I cannot stress enough how important regular and punctual attendance at school is. Please ensure your children come to school, and on time, every day. There is a correlation between irregular attendance and academic progress and social development and the impact can have lasting effects on students. The start of the school year is always a great time to set into play routines and plans around going to school.
