The Principal's Message...

Thank you to our community for the support they have provided to Jackie Aczel's family and friends. Jackie was the Assistant Principal Itinerant Teacher Hearing Support based at our school, a parent to Zoltan who attended St Clair Public School until last year, and an active member of our school community. Jackie's family advised the school that her passing was sudden after a short illness on Saturday 11th February. She will be sadly missed, and we will continue to provide ongoing support to her family, friends, and colleagues.

Newsletter going digital.

This will be the last newsletter that we will print and distribute to the youngest child in the family. From Week 9 of this term, you will be able to access the newsletter via our website and the Schoolstream app. We will also post a message on Facebook to let you know the newsletter is available to read. I have made this decision to enable the newsletter to have more photos and content whilst being mindful of our carbon footprint. Morning Drop off and afternoon pick-ups.

- Drop Off students are not able to enter the school before 8.30am. We encourage families to say
 goodbye to your child/children at the gate. Students will then drop their bag off outside their classroom
 and go into the playground until the bell goes at 9am.
- Dismissal There are two exit points in the afternoon which are the front gate and back gate. Dismissal
 for mainstream students is at 3pm. The back gate will be opened at 2.55pm and we ask families to wait
 at the bottom hardcourt for their child/children. Class teachers will supervise the dismissal of students
 from the bottom hardcourt.
- Front gate -Students will exit from the front gate at 3pm once the bell has gone. Parents are to wait for their child/children outside the front gate. Please do not wait in the car park due to safety reasons.
- Please talk to your child about where they will be picked up and feel free to send a message to the classroom teacher via Seesaw.

Assemblies

Assemblies will commence this term and families will have an opportunity to attend. Assemblies will be Thursday fortnightly in Weeks 6, 8 and 10 at 2pm. Visitors are asked to go straight to the hall and not wait in the student playground. Instead of class items at assemblies we will have an Education Week Concert in Term 3.

Basketball

During Term 1 from Week 4 to 10, each class will participate in a weekly Basketball Skills Clinic. The clinic will be implemented by coaches from Blacktown Basketball Association. The program will operate weekly. Please see the timetable below for your child's day:

Thursday: Classes 7, 10, 11, 1 (odd weeks), 6 (even weeks), 13, 15 & 14 Friday: Classes 1 (even weeks), 3, 4, 6 (odd weeks), 8, 9,12, 16 & 18

The program teaches the skills of basketball in a fun, safe and positive atmosphere. The clinic will also teach the importance of physical activity to health, resiliency, sportsmanship, and being a supportive individual. The lessons will be individually designed for the age and skill level of each class. The clinic will be conducted on our Hardcourt/COLA area.

The cost of the clinic is being subsided by a donation of \$2500 from St Clair Public School P & C as part of their giving back initiative. The remaining funds are from the Premier's Sports Grant and school funds. There is no cost for your child to participate.



Welcome to Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden 2023! We have so much to look forward to in this year's program. I have some exciting new recipes to cook with the students and fun activities to do in the garden.

As for mandatory lessons in the kitchen... Students, so far, know how to be safe in the kitchen and in the classroom. Though most of the students were familiar with how to be safe in the kitchen, it is always good to be reminded. The participating SAKG students started their first lesson in week 3 and what a success it was!

A very exciting time for everyone, especially the year 3 and newly enrolled students as they joined us in the kitchen for the very first time.

The focus of our Week 4 lessons was how to be safe using a knife, peeler, and grater. The students, especially stage 2 students, were so eager to be in the kitchen and start cooking. Of course, our cooking lessons for year 3 are going to be very simple and I assured them the tool they will be using most is their fingers.

Next week is our garden week. We are going to focus on how to be safe in the garden, and how to use gardening tools. I am looking forward to having everyone learning together and most of all growing food together.

Thank you to all the parents who visited our kitchen and garden during the Meet-the-Teacher session last week. We are so proud to show everyone what we have achieved so far in this amazing program. We also thank all the families who have continuously supported us throughout the years. Your encouraging comments truly mean a lot.

What's growing in our garden this season? Though we have had some hot weather, our vegetables (amazingly enough) have survived. We have pumpkins, silverbeet, chards, zucchinis, cucumbers, tomatoes, okra, bitter melons, Chinese long melon, amaranth, long beans, tomatillo, potatoes, grapes, herbs, and corn. Most of these vegetables are ready to be harvested. In week 6, it will be our first cooking lesson and we will enjoy these delicious vegetables.

I look forward to seeing everyone in the garden next week. Until next time.


