Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden (SAKG)News...

Autumn has arrived with many lovely sunny days but there has also been unseasonal rain. The best thing about the Autumn season is that we get to take a break from our usual gardening activities as we prepare our soil and garden beds for next Spring season. Students were busy doing just that. Class 1 and Class 3 started making bio-degradable pots and planting seeds in them. Students are learning about the advantages of using biodegradable pots, that being their ability to break down quickly, allowing it to go straight into the ground, rather than having to transfer it from the pot. This means no root disturbance, no transplant shock, and so much fun making these cute pots. Some of the seeds are already sprouting; our cauliflower, broccoli and beans are doing particularly well. Fingers crossed, we will have better weather this year and can expect a bountiful harvest.

Our first week of cooking was a success. Stage 3 made some delicious *Pork Gyoza and Vegetable Gyoza*. We also enjoyed *Fried Rice* with this dish. Our fried rice consists of corn, shallots and our delicious free-range eggs. Stage 2 made *Silverbeet and Cheese Puff Rolls* alongside *Pasta with Broccoli, Lemon, and Garlic Sauce*. Surprisingly enough, our "non-broccoli eaters' enjoyed this dish. Our broccoli was from our garden last year, which we simply blanched and froze, and was perfectly delicious with this meal. It was such a great week as we were able to put into practice everything that we learned a few weeks ago.

Thank you to all the students who worked so hard. Your listening skills, following instructions and your teamwork really made our time in the kitchen successful. I am looking forward to seeing you soon in the kitchen and garden so we can plant, harvest, prepare, cook, and enjoy meals together. Until next time. *Cazendra*.


