# **Drought Relief Mufti Day**

Next Tuesday August 14<sup>th</sup> we are holding a drought relief mufti day to raise desperately needed funds for our farmers. Our students are asked to come dressed as a farmer or a farm animal and donate a gold coin. Of course they are more than welcome to donate a little more. Below is an email I received from one of our own parents. I am sure you will agree that this very moving email sends a clear message about the hardships currently faced by our farming communities. Thank you to our SRC for organising this day.

I just wanted to say a massive thank you to everyone organising the Mufti Day to help farmers.

My Parents, \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*'s Grandparents are some of those farmers.

I see first hand, the impact drought has on people. I have seen my Dad sitting in his chair, staring into space for hours on end, knowing what he's thinking and trying my best to make him see positives. I have seen my Mum work herself into the ground and have a heart attack while cleaning out water troughs, only to pick herself up off the ground 15 minutes later and go on with her day.

My Parents spend \$4500 every week to feed their cattle and sheep. This is before they buy food for themselves, pay their bills and their mortgage. They feed their animals first because they are their livelihood and they would rather go hungry themselves than see their animals starving.

You don't realise that you are actually saving a man from hanging himself, you're saving a mother from taking her little ones and leaving because she can't go on, you're saving beautiful animals from wandering around in the dirt, looking for food that just isn't there, and finally collapsing and dying, you're saving mother cows from making themselves go into early labour and delivering a dead calf because she knows she won't have milk to feed it.

My Parents are just two of the many, many farmers that struggle every day, and tiny schools like yours are the ones making a difference to their lives.

I am so proud to have \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\* at such a caring school and I hope you are all proud of your efforts to contribute to the farmers, and I hope you know how grateful they are.

# **Tell Them From Me Survey**

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a *Tell Them From Me* student survey in Term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 27 August and 26 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

If you <u>do not</u> want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by Monday 13<sup>th</sup> **August 2018**. Welcome back to Term 3! Upon returning from the school holidays, the garden completely turned around. Because of the frost in the morning, sadly some of our vegetables and plants died and some are barely surviving. During the first week of Term 3, the students made biodegradable pots and planted some seeds. They are now nicely tucked away in the greenhouse, away from the freezing cold weather. There was so much to do in the garden, such as getting rid of the weeds around the grape vines and mulching the area. We also had to collect some (a little damaged but still edible) peas, snow peas and sugar snaps from the garden. Making a biodegradable pot and planting seeds was definitely a preferred job but some students absolutely enjoyed being outdoors using the shovels and the wheelbarrows. Students started planting watermelons, rockmelons, dew melons, tomatoes, carrots and capsicums. Hopefully


