ard work is not going unnoticed as the Premier's Teaching Scholarship awards some of the state's leading educators.

Assistant Principal of St Clair Publis School, Jacqualine Aczel, has beer granted a \$10,000 scholarship to furthe her study into Aboriginal children with hearing disabilities.

"I was so excited when I heard I was successful, I'm very passionate about m work and know it will get the ball rollin for so much stuff in our area," she said. Conductive Hearing Loss Program, which targets Aboriginal children as they are more likely to have middle ear conditions. The program works with students one-on-one to assist with their learning as well as providing free screenings and information for parents.

"There's some amazing programs oing on in rural areas such as Dubbo and he Northern Territory that have hugmounts of sponsorships and resources in looking forward to seeing what I car tring back with me," she said. 20 scholarships, with a total value o 250,000, have been awarded.

Tell Them From Me Survey

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a *Tell Them From Me* student survey in Term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 27 August and 26 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

If you <u>do not</u> want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by Monday 13th **August 2018**. Do you know of other family and friends in the St Clair area with a child ready for school? Let them know now is the best time to begin the enrolment process.



Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden News





week we used yellow split peas and green split peas in our menu. Different types vary greatly in nutrition, appearance, taste and use. Yellow split peas are the ones I love to use. They are easy and quick to prepare because of the size of the peas and are perfect for our Indian dish 'dahl'. The green split peas were perfect for making pea and ham soup, vegetarian 'sausage' rolls and even for adding them into our salad. The split peas in our fritters and egg frittatas were also yummy! What's the best thing about legumes? Not only are they nutritious and high in fibre and protein, they are also super cheap if you buy them dried (not canned). Why not try and cook some pumpkin and yellow split pea fritters? (see below for recipe).

Our garden is doing okay considering we haven't had good rain lately. I try to water it twice a week and cover the plants with sugar cane mulch to keep them moist. Some of the plants are starting to flower; in a couple of weeks those flowers will eventually dry up and produce some seeds for

next year's winter crops. The students were busy helping me clear the back garden (next to the grape area) for our new and exciting Australian native bush garden. For the next few weeks, we will be doing a lot of preparation as well as planting some seedlings ready for Spring. The sunflowers, beetroot, carrots and beans are starting to sprout. We are still

waiting on some zucchinis, watermelons and rockmelons to sprout but I am confident they will appear soon. In the garden, we have loads of lettuce, coriander, silverbeet, spinach, brussel sprouts, cabbages and chards. We also harvested our potatoes, peas, wombok, snow peas and sugar snaps. These were used in our dishes!

Thank you to the parents who donated seeds and some citrus fruit. Thank you Mrs
Healey for donating olive oil and Ms Brooks for the bags of rice and sugar. I would also
like to thank parents who paid \$5 donations for Term 3. We will let your child/children know when we are
going to have the "thank you" party. Thank you for your continued support!

Would you like to donate? For the kitchen, we need: dishwashing detergent, RICE OIL, butter, brown or white rice, vermicelli rice noodles, canned tomatoes, cheese and yoghurt. For the garden, we need: seeds (spinach, corn, sunflowers), sprouting potatoes, sugar cane mulch and cow manure.

Pumpkin and yellow split pea fritters

24 servings

Ingredients:

- 1 cup pumpkin, uncooked grated
- 1 cup yellow split peas, cooked
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon curry powder
- 1 teaspoon salt

rice or vegetable oil for frying

What to do:

- 1. In a large bowl, combine uncooked pumpkin, egg, flour baking powder and salt. Mix until smooth.
- 2. Heat oil in a pan. Gently drop batter by the spoonful into hot oil. Shape it like a pancake.
- Fry until golden brown, about 2 minutes. Flip and fry the other side for another 2 minutes or until golden brown.
- 3. Serve with sweet and sour sauce or sweet chili sauce *optional.
